Approval of Commission Minutes

Planning & Zoning Board Recommendations

RR-18-007 Robert Stottle is requesting to re-zone a portion of his property (approximately 3.5 acres) located off Reno Springs Road, Reeds Spring Mo (parcel #07-2.0-04-000-000-003.001) from A-1 to M-2 for a meat processing plant. The Board voted 7 to 1 to recommend DENIAL of the re-zoning. Presiding Commissioner Dennis Wood allowed time for anyone to speak for or against the recommendation. Robert Stottle spoke in favor and several concerned neighbors spoke against the Meat Processing Plant.

The matter to approve the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Board on requesting to re-zone (parcel #07-2.0-04-000-000-003.001) from A-1 to M-2 for a meat processing plant was brought to decision by a roll call vote: Smythe – yes; Maples –yes; Wood - yes.
