Presiding Commissioner Mark Maples & Denise Dickens opened the meeting with the pledge of allegiance to the flag, following the pledge Northern Commissioner Wayne Blades lead the prayer. Approval of Commission Minutes

The matter to approve the minutes for Stone County Commission meeting dated January 7, 2021 was brought to decision by a roll call vote: Smythe – yes; Maples – yes; Blades – yes. Minutes ordered approved.

Order Adopting a Code of Ethics

County Counsel William McCullah presented the Commission an Order adopting a Code of Ethics which governs conflicts of interest and substantial interest for certain county officers and employees. Per Revised Missouri State Statute Chapter 105, the Order needs to be reviewed and readopted every two years.

The matter to adopt and sign an Order adopting a Code of Ethics was brought to decision by a roll call vote: Smythe – yes; Maples – yes; Blades – yes. Matter carried, Order approved and signed.



AN ORDER ADOPTING A CODE OF ETHICS TO ESTABLISH A PROCEDURE TO DISCLOSE CONFLICTS OF INTEREST AND SUBSTANTIAL INTERESTS FOR CEPTAIN COUNTY OFFICEDS AND INTERESTS.

Whereas, Chapter 105 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri governs conflicts of

Whereas, Section 105.485 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri permits a political subdivision to adopt an ordinance establishing a procedure to disclose conflicts of interest and a phenoital less than the procedure of the proc

Whereas, on this Commission has on several occasions adopted and re-adopted a code of ethics establishing a procedure to disclose conflicts of interest and substantial interests for certain county officers and employees: and

Whereas, Section 105.485 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri requires that a politic subdivision adopt such an ordinance biannially.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED AS FOLLOWS

Section 1. <u>Declaration of Policy.</u> The proper operation of government requires that public officials and employees be independent, impartial and responsible to the people; that government decisions and policy be made in the proper channels of the opportunity of the proper policy operation of the proper consideration of these public have confidence in the integrity of its government. In recognition of these policy, there is thereby established a procedure for disclosure by cortain officials and confidence in the integrity of the government of the property of the pr

- Section 2. Conflicts of Interest.
 - a. All elected and appointed officials as well as employees of a political subdivision must comply with section 105.454 of Missouri Revised Statutes on conflicts of interest as well as any other state law governing official conduct.
 - Any member of the governing body of a political subdivision who has a "substantial or private interest" in any measure, bill, order or ordinance.

Section 3. <u>Disclosure Reports.</u> The County's Presiding Commissioner (being the County's chief administrative officer), the Clerk of the County commission (being the County's chief purchasing officer) shall disclose the following information by May 1, or County's chief purchasing officer) shall disclose the following information by May 1, or County of Co

- a. For such person, and all persons within the first degree of consenguinity of sfilling tof such person, the date and the identities of the parties to each transaction with a total value in excess of five hundred dollars, if any, the such person had with the political subdivision, other than compensation received as an employee or payment of any tax, fee or penalty due to the political subdivision, and other than transfers for no consideration to the
- b. The date and the identities of the parties to each transaction known to the person with a total value in excess of five hundred dollars, if any, that any business entity in which such person had a substantial interest, had with the political subdivision, other than payment of any tax, fee or penalty due to the political subdivision or transactions involving payment for providing consideration to the political subdivision and other than transfers for no consideration to the political subdivision.
- c. Each candidate for the offices of the County's Presiding Commissione (being the County's chief administrative officer), the Clerk of the County Commission (being the County chief purchasing officer) shall disclose by SMO, the following information for the previous calendary vear:
 - The name and address of each of the employers of such persor from whom income of one thousand dollars or more was received
 - The name and address of each sole proprietorship that he owned the name, address and the general nature of the business conducte of each general partnership and joint venture in which he was

participant for each partnership or joint venture unless such name and addresses are filled by the partnership or joint venture with the secretary of state; the name, address and general nature of the business conducted of any closely held corporation or limite business conducted of any closely held corporation or limite class of the outstanding stock or limited partnership units; and the name of any publicly traded corporation or limited partnership that is listed on a regulated stock exchange or automated quotation system in which the person owned two percent or more of any class or

 The name and address of each corporation for which such person served in the capacity of a director, officer or receiver.

Section 4. <u>Filing of Reports.</u>

- The financial interest statements shall be filed at the following times, but no person is required to file more than one financial interest statement in any
 - 1. Every person required to file a financial interest statement shall file the statement annually not later than May 1 and the statement shall cover the calendar year ending the immediately preceding December 31; provided that any person required to report may supplement the financial interest statement to report additional interests acquired after December 31 of the covered year until the date of filing of the
 - Each person appointed to office shall file the statement within thirty days of such appointment or employment covering the calendar year ending the previous December 31
 - Every candidate required to file a personal financial disclosurs statement shall file no later than fourteen days after the close of filing at which the candidate seeks nomination or election or nomination be caucus. The time period of this statement shall cover the twelver months prior to the closing date of filing for candidacy.
- Financial disclosure reports giving the financial information required in Section 3 shall be filed with the local political subdivision and with the Missouri Ethics Commission. The reports shall be available for public inspection and copying during normal business hours.

Section 5. Filing of Ordinance. A certified copy of this order shall be sent within ter days of its adoption to the Missouri Ethics Commission. Section 6. <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval and shall remain in effect until amended
